CAP. XL.

An Ordinance to continue certain Acts therein mentioned, relating to the Administration of Justice in the Inferior District of Gaspé.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient further to continue for a limited time certain Acts hereinaster mentioned, relating to the Administration of Justice in the inferior District of Gaspé :- Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by His Ex. cellency the Governor of the Province of Lower Canada, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of the said Province, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, " An Act to make tem-" porary provision for the Government of Lower Canada," And it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the same, that a certain Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter five, intituled, "An Act to extend the provisions of a certain Act therein mentioned, as " far as the same relates to the judicature of the Inferior District of Gaspé, and " more effectually to provide for the due administration of justice in the said Dis-"trict," and a certain other Act passed in the fourth year of the said Reign, chapter seven, intituled, " An Act to amend a certain Act therein mentioned, and fur-"ther to extend the jurisdiction of the Provincial Court for the Inferior District of "Gaspé," as the same are continued and amended by a certain other Act passed in the sixth year of the same Reign, chapter twenty-five, intituled, " An Act to amend " and continue for a limited time, two certain Acts therein mentioned relating to the "Judicature in the Inferior District of Gaspé," and as the said Acts are further continued and amended by a certain other Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, chapter fifty, intituled, " An "Act to continue and amend certain Acts relating to the Judicature of the Infe-" rior District of Gaspé," shall be, and the said Acts (which have since been continued by other Acts of the Provincial Legislature, until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, when they would otherwise expire,) are hereby continued and shall remain in force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and no longer.

CAP. XLI.

An Ordinance to remove certain doubts as to the extension of the benefit of the Warehousing system, established by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the third and fourth years of His late Majesty's Reign, to duties imposed by Provincial Acts.

Picamble.

HEREAS doubts have arisen whether the provisions and enactments of the sections hereinafter mentioned, of a certain Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, made and passed in the third and fourth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter fifty-nine, intituled "An Act to regu-" late the Trade of the British possessions abroad," do or do not extend to duties payable under any Act of the Provincial Legislature, on any goods or merchandize arriving from sea in any vessel entered at the Custom House of the Port of Quebec or the Port of Montreal;—to remove such doubts, to promote the objects for which the said Act was passed, and for the greater facility and encouragement of the Trade of this Province:—Be it Declared, Ordained and Enacted by His Excellency the Governor of the Province of Lower Canada, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of the saidProvince, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make temporary pro-" vision for the Government of Lower Canada;" and it is hereby Ordained and Enacted
