3 Victoria – Chapter 13 (Session 5)

An Ordinance to continue for a limited time, a certain Act therein mentioned, in relation to secret incumbrances on lands.

Whereas the Act hereinafter mentioned has been attended with very salutary effects, and it is expedient to continue the same:—Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by His Excellency the Governor of this Province of Lower Canada, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of this said Province, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada," and also by virtue and under the authority of a certain other Act of the same Parliament, passed in the Session held in the second and third years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament, for making temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada;" and it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the said Acts of Parliament, that the Act passed in the ninth year of His Majesty King George the Fourth, and intituled, "An Act to provide for the more effectual extinction of Secret Incumbrances on Lands than was heretofore in use in this Province," which said Act has been since continued in force by other Acts until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty, when it would otherwise expire, shall be, and the said Act is hereby continued, and shall remain in force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty five, and no longer.
