## An Ordinance to appropriate certain Sums therein mentioned to the encouragement of Education.

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate certain sums of money for the encouragement of Education in this Province:—Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by His Excellency the Governor of the Province of Lower Canada, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of the said Province, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada;" And it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, by Warrants under his hand, to authorize the payment of the sums hereinafter mentioned, out of any unappropriated monies that may be in the hands of the Receiver General, that is to say: To the Committee of Management of the National School at Quebec, towards maintaining the said School, a sum not exceeding one hundred and eleven pounds, two shillings and two pence currency,

To the Trustees of the Sherbrooke Academy, a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds currency; that is to say, a sum not exceeding one hundred pounds currency, as an aid towards discharging any debts they may have incurred in maintaining the said Academy, during the year ended on the tenth day of October last; and a sum not exceeding one hundred pounds currency, towards defraying the expenses of maintaining the said Academy during the present year ending on the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine,

To the Reverend Mr. Balfour, as an aid in support of his School at Waterloo, in the Township of Shefford, provided that five persons be qualified at the said Establishment to be Teachers of Elementary Schools; a sum not exceeding one hundred pounds currency,

II. And be it further Ordained and Enacted by the, authority aforesaid, that every person to whom shall be entrusted the expenditure of any of the monies hereby appropriated, shall make up detailed accounts of such expenditure, shewing the sums advanced to the Accountant, the sum actually expended, the balance, if any, remaining in his hands, and the amount of the monies hereby appropriated to the purpose for which such advance shall

have been made, remaining unexpended in the hands of the Receiver General, and that every such account shall be supported by Vouchers therein distinctly referred to by numbers corresponding to the numbering of the items in such account, and shall be made up and closed on the tenth day of April and tenth day of October in each year in which such expenditure shall be made; and shall be attested before a Justice of the Court of King's Bench, or a Justice of the Peace, and shall be transmitted to the Officer whose duty it shall be to receive such account within fifteen days next after the expiration of the said periods respectively.

III. And be it further Ordained and Enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Ordinance shall be accounted for to her Majesty, her heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, shall direct.
