2 Victoria - Chapter 59 (Session 4)

An Ordinance to suspend for a limited time, certain sections of the Ordinance for the better Packing and Inspection of Flour and Meal.

Whereas it is expedient to suspend, for a limited time, certain provisions of the Ordinance hereinafter mentioned, which could not be conveniently carried into effect, until after a certain delay:—Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by His Excellency the Governor of the Province of Lower Canada, by and with the advice and consent of the Special Council for the affairs of the said Province, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada;" And it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the same, that the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh sections of the Ordinance passed by the Governor of this Province, and with the advice of the Special Council for the affairs thereof, during the present session, in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter ten, intituled, "An Ordinance to suspend certain Acts therein mentioned, and to regulate in a better manner the packing and inspection of Flour and Indian Meal," (which said sections relate to the construction, materials, branding and marking of the casks in which Flour or Meal is to be packed,) shall be, and the said sections are hereby suspended, and shall have no force or effect, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty: Provided always, that until the day last aforesaid, all the provisions and enactments of the several Acts, suspended by the said Ordinance, relating to the materials, construction, branding and marking of the casks in which Flour or Meal is to be packed, shall be and remain in force, and for any contravention thereof, the same penalty shall be incurred, as by the said Ordinance is imposed for any contravention of the sections thereof, hereby suspended in a like matter, any thing in the said Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And be it Declared and further Ordained and Enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the dimensions of the staves mentioned in the twenty-fifth section of the said Ordinance, are, and shall be held to be, the dimensions thereof from croe to croe, that is to say, the length of the staves, of all barrels mentioned in the said section, shall be twenty-seven inches from croe to croe, and the length of the staves of all half-barrels therein mentioned, shall be twenty-two inches from croe to croe.
