CAP. II.

An Act in further Addition to an Act, intitled An Act for regulating Petit Juries and declaring the Qualification of Jurors+.

*** HEREAS the Number of Frecholders in feveral Coun-W 🖉 ties within this Province, are injufficient for Grand and Pe-*** tit Juries, whereby Trials are often continued over, and great the Governor, Council, and Affembly, That any Perfon refiding in the Islands of Cape Breton, or St. Jubn's, in this Province, not be-ing a Freeholder, but that shall have Personal Estate to the Value of Ten Pounds and upwards, shall be obliged to ferve on Juries, being duly fummoned for that Purpofe; and in Cafe of Neglect shall incur and pay the fame Fines and Penalties which, in the like Cafe, are imposed by an Act made and passed in the Thirty Third Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intitled An Act for regulating Petit Juries and declaring the Qualification of Jurors+; and allo by an Act made and passed in the Thirty Third Year of His late Majesty's -Reign*, intitled An AEt in Addition to an AEt, intitled " An AEt for " regulating Petit Juries and declaring the Qualification of Jurors:" And that all Persons so summoned by the Provost Marshal or his Deputy, shall attend and serve as Jurors, unless they shall make it appear by Oath before the Court, that they are not poffeffed of Perfonal Effate to the Value of Ten Pounds.

CAP. III.

An Act in Addition to an Act made in the Fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign+, intitled An Act to enable the Inhabitants of the feveral Townships within this Province to maintain their Poor.

HERE AS it is provided in and by an AEt made in the Fourth W Year of His prefent Majefly's Reign*, intitled An Act to enable the Inhabitants of the feveral Townships within this Pro-"vince to maintain their Poor, "That it shall and may be lawful for the Freeholders of any Township within this Province, where there are Fifty or more Families Freeholders refident, to meet on the Fift Monday in January Annually, and to vote fuch a Sum of Money as they (fhall judge necessary for the current Year, to support and maintain their Poor;" And Whereas there are fome Townships who do not confist of Fifty Families Freeholders refident, which Townships labour under great Inconveniency for want of a Power to make Provision for their Poor; For Remedy

Remedy whereof, Be it Enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That it shall and may be lawful for the Freeholders of all such Townships, tho' they do not confist of Fifty Families Freeholders refident, to meet on the First Monday of *January* Annually, and there to proceed in Manner and Form as is preferibed by the afore recited Act, in the making Provision for their Poor; and that the faid Freeholders shall be intitled to all the other Powers and Prescriptions contained in the faid Act, any Law, Usuage, or Custom to the contrary in any wife notwithstanding.

CAP. IV.

An A'C'T to explain and amend the feveral Acts of this Province, relating to the Affize of Bread, and for ascertaining the Standard of Weights and Measures.

*** HEREAS Doubts have arifen respecting the Distribution of W the several Fines and Forfeitures incurred on the Acts made and Preamble. * paffed by the General Affembly of this Province, relating to the Affize of Bread and for afcertaining the Standard of

Weights and Measures, Be it therefore Enasted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That for the future all Fines and Forfeitures, incurred on the faid Acts, shall be applied One Half to the Clerks of the Market or Informer, and the other Half to the Poor of the Town where the Offence shall be committed, any Law, Usuage, or Cuftom to the contrary notwithstanding.

CAP. V.

An ACT for regulating the Times and Places for holding the feveral Courts of Justice therein named.

FXX E it Enabled by the Governor, Council, and Affembly, That B the General Quarter Seffions of the Peace, and the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, for the County of Annapolis, shall be held in the Town of Annapolis, on the Third Tuesday of January, and on the Second Tuesday of September ; For the County of Lunenburg, in the Town of Lunenburg on the Second Tuesday of April, and on the Second Tuesday of October; For Queen's County, in the Town of Liverpool, on the First Tuesday of February, and on the Third Tuesday of September ; For King's County, in the Town of Horton, on the last Tuesday of May, and on the First Tuesday of Qctober ; And for the County of Cumberland, in the Town of Cumberland, on the First Tuesday of June, and on the Second Tuesday of October; which Courts shall be held at the faid Places respectively, on the faid Days in every Year.

The Freeholders of any Township may meet annually and make Provision for their Poor, altho' they do not confift of Fifty Families refident therein.
