Boat passing the Rivers from one Town to another, or to or from Mill, or for the necessary Provision of the Vessel's Crew.

III. And be it Enacted, That if any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, or Peale, (the Produce of this Province) shall be laden on board any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, before fuch Bond is given, the fame shall be forfeited, and may be feized by any of feited, and may be His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, who are hereby impowered to feize the fame.

IV. And be it further Enacted, That for the Bond herein directed to be taken, and Certificate thereof, a Fee of One Shilling shall be paid; and for a Certificate of the landing of the Articles' Certificates. herein specified, a Fee of One Shilling shall be paid, and no more.

V. And be it also Enabled, That the Forfeitures incurred by this Act, shall be recovered, on the Oath of one credible Wit- recovered in any nefs, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record in this Province; Court of Record. and after deducting the Expences of Profecution, be divided One Moiety to His Majesty, for the Use of the Government of this Province, and the other Moiety to him or them who shall inform, feize or fue for the fame.

VI. And be it also further Enabled, That where no Naval Offi- where no Naval ser shall be refident, the Bond herein directed to be taken, and Officer shall be Certificates to be given of the fame, and of the landing thereof, relident, Bonds and Certificates to thall be by one of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace of the Town be by a Juffice of or Place where the faid Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal; or the Peace. Peafe, shall be loaded or landed.

CAP. III.

An AEt in further Amendment of an Act made in the 6. Geo. 3. c. 3. 6th Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled An AEt concerning Bail.

KOTTOR HEREAS by an Act made in the Eighth Year of His Preamble. W present Majesty's Reign, intitled An Act for altering, amending, and continuing an Act made in the fixth XEXEX Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign; intitled "An Act concerning Bail," it is among other Things Enacted " That in all " Caufes where the Sum fued for shall exceed Ten Pounds, the " Goods, Chattels, or Estate of no Person shall be attached, un-" less the Plaintiff, his Agent or Attorney, shall make and fubscribe an Affidavit in Writing, that the Defendant is justly "indebted to the Plaintiff in the Sum of Ten Pounds or up-" wards;"

be made on Goods, Sec. upon the Plaistiff's filing an Affidavit that the Defendant is jultly indebted to him in the Sum of Three Pounds or upwards; " wards;" which Restriction is found to be very inconvenient; For remedy whereof, Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly. That from and after the Publication of this Act, the Provost Marschal or his Deputy, shall and may attach the Goods, Chattels, or Estate of any Debtor or Debtors, upon the Plaintiff, his Attorney or Agent, filing an Affidavit in the Clerk's Office of the Court, from whence such Writ of Attachment shall issue of the Defendant is justly indebted to the Plantiff in the Sum of Three Pounds or upwards; which Attachment shall be made and levied in the same manner as is directed and prescribed to be done by the Act made in the Eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign above recited.

CAP. IV.

An Act for further regulating the Market at Halifar.

******** E it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Alfembly, That B from and after the Publication of this Act, each and every Perfon who shall take a Stall in the Market House in Halifax, by the Year or Quarter, shall pay to the Keeper the Sum of Four Pounds per Annum, to be paid Quarterly; and those who shall take a Stall for a shorter Time, shall pay Nine Pence per Day; in lieu of the Rents now paid, any Law, Usuage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And be it alfo Enacted, That any Perfon or Perfons, being refident Inhabitants of any Town or Place in this Province, (Halifax excepted) bringing from the Country into the Town of Halifax, any Number or Quantity of Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, or Poultry, alive or dead, Roots, Greens, and other Vegetables, fhall have free Liberty, by themfelves or Agents, to kill, fell and difpofe of the fame by Hand or otherwife, in the Streets or Lanes of the faid Town, or in any Houfe, Bulk or Stall in the fame, at any Time whether within Market Hours or without; any Law, Ufuage, or Cuftom to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. Provided always, That all Acts or Clauses of Acts against Forestallers and Regrators, shall be as effectual and in as full force, as if this Act had not been made.

IV. And be it Enabled. That this Act thall continue and be in force for and during the Term of One Year, from the Publication thereof, and until the End of the Settion of the General Affembly then next following.

The Rates of the Stalls in the Market House regulated.

Perfors from the Country, bringing to Halifax, any Neat Cattle, &c. may dispose thereof in any of the Streets dec. of the faid Town, &c.

This Act not to affect the Laws sgainft Forefallers and Regrators.

This ACt to continue one Year. 1769.
