

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday the Twenty Eighth Day of May, 1765, in the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, and there continued by several Prorogations until the Twenty Second Day of October, 1768, in the eighth year of His said Majesty's Reign; being the Seventh Session of the Fourth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

8 George III – Chapter 11 (Session 2)

An Act for continuing an Act made in the Sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act to prevent the Multiplicity of Law Suits.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, that an Act made in the sixth year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act to prevent the Multiplicity of Law Suits, shall be and continue from the expiration thereof, and the same is hereby continued in force for two years, from and after the expiration of the said Act, and to the end of the then next session of the General Assembly.
