

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Fifth Day of June, 1771, in the Eleventh Year of his said Majesty's Reign, being the Second Session of the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

11 George III – Chapter 19

An Act for altering, amending, and further continuing an Act made in the Sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for prescribing the Forms of Writs and the Manner of issuing the same."

Whereas several inconveniences have arisen by means of the present form of the writ of attachment.

I. Be it enacted by the Governor, council, and assembly, that hereafter the following form of attachment shall issue and no other.

FORM OF ATTACHMENT.

ff. George the Third by the Grace of God of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King Defender of the Faith &c.

To the Provost Marshal or his Deputy, greeting.

We command you to attach the goods, chattels or estate of _____ to the value of _____ and also to summon the said _____ (if to be found within your precinct) to appear before our justices of our _____ to be holden at _____ then and there to answer the suit of _____ to the damage of the said _____ as _____ the sum of _____ hereof fail not, and make due return of this writ, and your doings thereon according to law, twelve days before the said _____ witness _____ this _____ day of _____ in the year of our reign, anno domini.

II. And be it further enacted, that an act made in the sixth year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled "an Act for prescribing the forms of writs and the manner of issuing the same," also an act made in the eighth year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An act for altering, amending and continuing an act made in the sixth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for prescribing the forms of writs and the manner of issuing the same,'" together with this present act, shall be and are hereby continued in force for two years from the time of the expiration of the said acts, and until the end of the session of the general assembly then next following.
