CAP. III.

An ACT for more effectually preventing the Defertion of Seamen and Soldiers from his Majesty's Navy and Army in this Province.

XXXX HEREAS notwithstanding the Provision made by the Act of Parliament, and the Acts of the General Afferphly of this Propince, for preventing the Defertion of Seamen from bis Majesty's Ships of War, and of Soldiers from his Majesty's Troops in this Province, many evil minded Persons do barbour, conceal, assist and even excite them to desert, to the great Detriment of his Majesty's Service; for Remedy whereof,

1. Be it Enacted, by the Livutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That if any Person thall harbour or conceal any Stranger or idle wandering Person, who has not a Certificate or Pals from one of his Majett'y Justices of the Peace within this Province, or from an Officer commanding any of Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or from the commanding Officer of any Regiment, Troop or Company, to which they belong, which shall fet forth from whence such Person shall have come, and the Place to which they are to pass, and shall not use his utmost Endeavour to apprehend, or cause such idle or wandering Person to be apprehended and conveyed before some Justices of Peace, such Person being thereof convicted before any two or more of his Majesty's Justices of Peace either on Confession on Oath of one credible Witness, shall forefeit a Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds, nor loss than Ton Pounds, one Half to the Informer or Professior, and the other half to the Poor of the Township where the Offence shall be committed to be levied by Diffress and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattles by Warrant from such Justices, and if sufficient Distress cannot be found, it shall be lawful for fuch Justices to committather Person so offending to Goal, or to the House of Correction, there to be kept to hard Labour for any Time, not exceeing Four Months, nor less than two Months.

If any Person shall harbour or conceal any Stranger or wandering person who has not a Pais,

and shall not use his Endeavour to apprehend fuchStranger & convey him before a Justice, on Conviction to forfeit not exceeding Twenty Pounds nor less than Ten Pounds.

II. And bent also Enacted, That if any Person shall advise or incite any Suaman or Soldier to defert, fuch Person so advising or inciting shall upon Conviction by the Oath of two or more credible Witnessos before awa of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace be liable to a fine of Forty pounds, for the Use of the poor of the Township where the Offence shall the committed, and be levied and recovered as aforefaid, and in Failure of payment thereof, or where no sufficient Distress can be found, whereon to levy the same, such Person shall be committed to Goal or the House of Correction, there to be kept to hard Labour for Twelve Months.

AnyPerson advising or inciting any Seaman or Soldier to desert, shall on a Conviction be liable to a Fine of Forty Pounds.

Provided always that any Person who shall have been profecuted and fined on the Act of Parliment for concaling or Har- Provito. bouring Deferters shall not be again prosecuted for the same offence on this Act.

IV. And provided also. That this Act and every Clause and Article therein contained shall be of Force for and during the present Rebellion in America, and no longer.

C A P. IV.

An ACT for continuing the several Acts relating to the Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax.

Continued to 31st December, 1778. E it Enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, that an Act made in the Eight Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for Granting to His Majesty a Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halisax, and also An Act made in the sisteenth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, in Amendment of the said Act, shall be, and the same are hereby continued in sorce from the Expiration thereof until the Thirty sirst Day of December One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty.

C A P. V.

An ACT for continuing an Act made in the 15th Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act to impower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, to prchibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, arms and Ammunition, or Salt-petre, or carrying the same Coastways.

E it Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act made in the fifteenth year of his present Majesty's Reign intitled, an Act impower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the Time being, to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, Arms and Amunition or Salt Petre, or carrying the Same Coastways, shall be, and continue, and the same is hereby continued in Force, from the Expiration thereof, for and during the present Rebellion in America only and no longer.
