

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. being the First Session of the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

10 George III – Chapter 13

An Act for continuing an Act made in the Eighth year of His present Majesty’s Reign, intituled “An Act for suppressing unlicensed Houses, and for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Persons hereafter to be licensed.”

Be it enacted by the Governor, council, and assembly, that an act made in the eighth year of his present Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act for suppressing unlicensed houses, and for granting to his Majesty a duty on persons hereafter to be licensed;” shall be and continue from the expiration thereof, and the same is hereby continued in force until the first day of July one thousand seven hundred and seventy one.
