

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Twelfth day of October, 1773, in the Thirteenth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth General-Assembly convened in the said Province.

13 George III – Chapter 11 (Session 2)

An Act for continuing an Act, made in the Eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for granting to his Majesty a Duty on Wheel-Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax."

Be it enacted, by the Governor, council and assembly, that an act made in the eighth year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An act for granting to his Majesty a duty on Wheel-Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax," shall be and continue, and the same is hereby continued in force from the expiration thereof, until the thirty first day of December, one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven.

II. And be it also enacted, that during the continuance of this act, there shall be yearly raised, levied, collected and paid, for each and every wheel carriage used within the peninsula of Halifax, by the owner or proprietor of such carriage, by and under the limitations, provisoes, pains and penalties, and for the purposes prescribed, directed and mentioned in and by the said above recited act, the like rates and taxes as are imposed by the said act.
