

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Sixth day of June, Anno Domini 1777, in the Seventeenth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

17 George III – Chapter 10

An Act for continuing the several Acts relating to the Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax.

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, that an Act made in the eight year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for Granting to His Majesty a Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax, and also an act made in the fifteenth year of his sad Majesty's reign, in amendment of the said Act, shall be, and the same are hereby continued in force from the expiration thereof until the thirty first day of December one thousand seven hundred and eighty.
