

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Sixth day of October, 1783, in the Twenty Third Year of his said Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

23 George III – Chapter 18

An Act in Amendment of, and for Continuing an Act made in the last General Assembly of this Province, intituled, "An Act to raise a Sum of Money towards keeping in Repair the Roads leading from Halifax to Windsor, and the District of Colchester."

Be it enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, and it is hereby enacted, that from, and after the publication of this act, there shall be only one turnpike gate, and that the same shall be placed on the bridge at Fort Sackville, and that all monies arising from the tolls collected at the said turnpike gate, shall be laid out on the repairs of the roads leading from Fort Sackville Bridge towards Windsor, and the district of Colchester.

II. And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall pull down, burn, cut or destroy the said turnpike gate, or any part thereof, or of the fences fixed for the protection of the same, or shall send threatening messages to the persons concerned in collecting the tolls at the said gate, or putting up and supporting the same, such person or persons, if found guilty of such offence or offences, shall be deemed guilty of felony with benefit of clergy.

III. And be it also enacted, that an act made in the last session of the general assembly, intituled, "An Act to raise a Sum of Money towards keeping in Repair the Roads leading from Halifax to Windsor, and the District of Colchester," together with the amendment thereto made by this act, shall be, and continue, and the same is continued in force for one year, and until the end of the session of the general assembly, then next following.
