At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALIFAX, on the fifth Day of December 1785, in the Twenty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by feveral Prorogations unto the Eighth Day of June, 1786, in the Twenty Sixth Year of this faid Majefty's Reign, being the Second Seffion of the Sixth General Affembly convened in the faid Province.

C A P. I.

AN ACT for continuing the feveral Laws mentioned therein, and also for altering the Impost Law hereby continued.

KXXXX E it enalted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, and it is E bereby enalted, that an Act passed in the last Session of the E General Affembly, intitled, "An Act to encourage and ex-" tend the Export of Fish, Lumber, and other Produce XXXXX .. of this Province to the West Indies, and also to revive, " alter and continue, the feveral Laws, relating to the Duties of Im-" post on Boer, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors," which Laws expired the Thirty first Day of December, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Four, and the several Laws thereby revived shall be continued to the period herein after mentioned; Provided acvertheless, that no clause in the faid Act hereby continued, shall be confirued to extend, to any Rum, Sugar or Molasses, imported into any Port or Forts within this Province; being the Produce of Spermaceti Candles manufactured within this Province, or of strained Oil shipped by the Manufacturers of faid Candles, or strainers of said Oil on their own Account, in any Veffel or Veffels of which they are not Owners or part Owners ; but that the faid Produce may be imported into any Port or Ports, within this Province in any other Vellel ar Vessels, free of Impost duty, upon the Owners thereof making the Affidavit in faid Act prescribed, any Thing therein contained on the contrary in any wise notwithstanding : Also an Act intitled, an AEI for the Establishment of Fees as regulated by the Governor and Council at the Request of the House of Affembly, together with the feveral Acts in Ad-dition to, and Amendment thereof, also an Act made in the fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign intrited, an All for the furmary Trial of Altians, together with the several Laws in Amendment thereof, also an Act intitled, an AET in Addition to, and Amendment of an AST for continuing

Act relating to the Duties of Import on Beer, Rum, &c. continued to the Period herein after mentioned.

Provided that as Claufe in faid AA fhall extend to any Rum, Sugar, or Molaffes imported into this Province being the Produce of Spermaceti Candlea or firained Oif manufactured in this Province and fhipped by the Manufacturers thereof.

An A C T to alter, amend and continue an Act passed in the Twenty Fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign intitled, An Act for more effectually raising a Duty of Excise on Wines, Rum, and certain other enumerated Articles, and for preventing Frauds in the Collection of the Revenue.

II.

HEREAS the Duties of Excise heretofore paid on Rum, and We and other spirits and also on Wine has been insufficient to an figure the Exigencies of Government.

I. Be it therefore Enaîted, by the Governor, Council and Affembly, and it is hereby Enaîted, That from and after the Publication hereof, all Rum and other diffilled Spirituous Liquors, and alfo all Wine of every kind, fold or expended within this Province, thall pay a further Excife Duty of three Pence per Gallon, in Addition to the Excife Duties heretofore paid on the fame Articles, which additional Excife Duty of three Pence per Gallon on Rum and other diffilled Spirits, and three Pence per Gallon on all Wine, thall be paid and collected in the Manner and Form, and under the like Penalties and Regulations contained in the faid Act intitled, An Ast for more effectually raifing a Duty of Excife on Wine, Rum and certain other enumerated Articles, and for preventing Frauds in the Collection of the Revenue.

II. And be it further Enacted, that all Stockholders under the Excise Law of this Province, who shall punctually settle their quarterly stock. Account with the Collector for the District wherein such Stock-Holder shall dwell within eight Days after the Expiration of each and every Quarter, such Person or Persons shall be entitled to have three Months credit given him for the Payment of the Ballance that shall appear to be due on such quarterly Settlement, provided such Ballance appearing due on such Settlement shall exceed the sum of Twenty Pounds, and provided the Stockholder so requiring Credit shall find one good and sufficient Persons at least, to become jointly and severally bound with him.

Preamble.

From and after Publication of this Act all Rum and Wines to pay a further. Excise of 3d per Gallon, in addition to the Excise Duty heretpfore paid.

Stockholders fettling their quarterly Stock Account with the Collector within Eight Days after the Expiration of the Quarter fhall have three Months credit for Payment of the Ballance, provided the Sum exceeds £. 20. and the Stockholder fo
