CAP. III.

AN ACT to prevent the destroying or desacing Mile-Posts, Mile-Boards or Mile-Stones erected or to be crected within this Province:

* HEREAS the crefting of Mile-Posts, and Boards or Mile Stones, tends greatly to the Convenience of the Public, and is, often a useful Direction to the Traveller. And whereas mischievious and ill disposed Persons bave in many Instances wanton-. ly and wickedly defaced and destroyed such Posts and Boards.

1. Be is therefore Enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Afsembly. That from and after the Publication hereof, whoever shall be found guilty of defacing, displacing, injuring or destroying any Post, Beard or Stone erected or be erected for the Purpole of ascertaining Distances shall on Conviction thereof before any two of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay the Sum of two Pounds, the" one half whereof to be given to the Profecutor, and the other half pay the fum of two paid in to the Treasurer of the County wherein such Offence shall be prosecutor the other committed for the Rurpole of repairing and erecting. Mile Boards within such County, and in Case the Party so convicted shall be unable to pay the fine imposed, it shall and may be lawful for such Justices to direct and order the Offender a corporal Punishment, not less, than Twenty Lashes, nor exceeding Thirty Lashes, to be inflicted at the most public Place within the said District in the usual and accultomed Minner,

Persons found guilty of defacing, difplacing &c.any Mile Post Board or Stone shall on conviction before two Justices pounds, one to the to the Tressurer of the County, if unsble to pay the fine, liable to a corporal punishment not exceeding thirty lather

AN ACT to authorise certain Commissioners to dispose of the Building wherein the General Assembly now fits; and also to adjust the Debt due from the Province to the Public School at Halitax.

* HEREAS the Province stands indebted in a considerable Sum of W Money for Principal and Interest to the Trustees of the Public School at Halifax or School Lottery Fund, as by the Public Ac. counts, settled and passed this Session of Assembly will appear. And whereas the Building with the Ground thereunto helonging, now used and occupied as an Assembly House will no longer peujeful or necessary to the Province, but would make a convenient Situation for the said public School in Halifax, and at the same time enable the Province to pay off a large pert of the debt due as aforesaid.

I. Be
