

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday the 4th day of December 1759, and in the 33^d year of His Majesty's Reign.

33 George II – Chapter 20 (Session 2)

An Act for further prolonging a Resolution of the Governor and Council, revived and put in Force by the General Assembly in the 32d Year of His Majesty's Reign.

Whereas the resolution or act of the government and council, revived and put in force by the general assembly, intituled, "An Act that foreign debts should not be pleadable in this province, unless for goods imported into the province, made the 2d day of February, 1749, in the 23d Year of His present Majesty's Reign," and amended and continued by a resolution or act made the 14th of January, 1751, is near expiring; and whereas it is thought highly expedient to continue the same for a further space of time;

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the governor, council, and assembly, and by the authority of the same it is hereby enacted, that the above recited resolution, or act of the governor and council, be in force and continue for the term of one year from and after the second day of October next, and until the end of the session of the general assembly, then next following.
