## An Act for continuing an Act, intitled' "An Act to prevent any private Trade or Commerce with the Indians."

Whereas the measures proposed by the Act, intitled, "An Act to prevent any private Trade or Commerce with the Indians," are found to be of great use, in keeping up a freindly correspondence and intercourse with the Indians; it is therefore thought that the continuing the said Act will greatly tend to the good of His Majesty's service, and to the advantage of His subjects in this Province. And whereas the said Act is only continued and to be in force for the term and space of two years, from and after the 21st day of May, 1760.

Be it therefore enacted by his Excellency the Governor, Council, and Assembly, and by the authority of the same it is hereby enacted, that the said Act, intitled, "An Act to prevent any private Trade or Commerce with the Indians," be and is hereby made perpetual, any matter or thing in the said Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
