At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday the 4^{th} day of December 1759, and in the 33^d year of His Majesty's Reign, and there continued by several Prorogations until Monday the 8^{th} Day of September, 1760, in the 34^{th} Year of His Majesty's Reign.

34 George II – Chapter 3

An Act to explain an Act made and passed in the 33d Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act to enable Proprietors to divide their Lands held in common and undivided."

Whereas in the second clause of the said Act it is set forth, that at the first meeting of the proprietors of any common lands, the said proprietors shall agree upon and appoint any other way and method of calling and summoning meetings for the future, as shall be most suitable and convenient to the proprietors: And whereas some doubts have arisen, whether such subsequent meetings should be within the county or township where such lands lie, or without?

It is hereby same and declared by his Excellency the Governor, Council and Assembly, that it was and is the intention of the Legislature, that all meetings of proprietors relating to the division of lands; or any other matter relative thereto, shall be held within the county where such lands lie, unless such meeting shall be agreed to be held in any other county in the Province, by a majority of the proprietors resident in the same.
