1 George III – Chapter 2

**An Act in Amendment of an Act, intituled, “An Act, directing the Proceedings against forcible Entry and Detainer.”**

Whereas in the Act, intituled, “An Act directing the Proceedings against forcible Entry and Detainer,” no provision is made for securing and maintaining the inheritance and title of minors, femes covert, persons non compos mentis, imprisoned, or absentees; Be it therefore enacted by the Honourable the Commander in Chief, Council, and Assembly, that nothing in the said Act shall extend or be construed to extend to bar the right of any minor, feme covert, or person non compos mentis, imprisoned, or absent from the Province, but they shall be intituled to sue for, and recover any lands or tenements within the Province aforesaid, to which they are intituled, within five years after such impediment shall be removed, any thing in the said Act to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
