At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday the 28th of May 1765 in the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign.

5 George III – Chapter 3

An Act for impowering the Justices of the Peace for the County of Halifax, to hold a Court of Special Sessions of the Peace at Windsor in said County, for the Townships of Windsor, Onslow, and Truro.

Whereas the great extent of the county of Halifax, and the distance between the town of Halifax, and the townships of Windsor, Onslow, and Truro, makes the attendance of persons resident in those townships; and the general sessions of the peace, held for the said county at Halifax, very inconvenient.

Be it enacted, by the Governor, council and assembly, that there shall be held and kept within the township of Windsor, in the county of Halifax, in every year, on the last Tuesday of June, and the second Tuesday of October, a special court of general sessions of the peace, and any three or more of the justices of the County of Halifax, one whereof to be the quorum, shall and may hold the said court, and such court shall have, hold, use, exercise and enjoy all and singular the powers, which are by law already given and granted unto courts of general sessions of the peace, so far as relates to all such matters and things arisen, or which shall arise within the said townships of Windsor, Onslow, and Truro.

Publish'd according to law, the 18th day of June, 1765.
