At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday the 28th day of May 1765, in the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, and there continued by several Prorogations, to Tuesday the Third Day of June, 1766, in the Sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign.

6 George III – Chapter 1 (Session 1)

An Act for the making perpetual, an Act made and pass'd in the 4th Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act for preventing Nusances, by Hedges, Wears, and other Incumbrances, obstructing the passage of Fish in the Rivers of this Province."

Be it enacted by the Commander in Chief the council and assembly, that an act, intitled, "An Act for preventing nusances, by hedges, wears [weirs], and other incumbrances, obstructing the passage of fish, in the rivers of this province," shall be, and the same is hereby made perpetual, any proviso or limitation in the said act notwithstanding.

Published according to law, the 5th July 1766.
