

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the fifth day of December 1785, in the Twenty Sixth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, and there continued by several Prorogations unto the Twenty Fifth Day of October, 1787, in the Twenty Eighth Year of his Majesty's Reign, being the Third Session of the Sixth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

28 George III – Chapter 11

An Act in Amendment of an Act for establishing a public Market at the Market House in Halifax, and for regulating the same.

Whereas the rate of eight pounds per annum for the hire of the stalls in the said market house is found to be too high, for remedy whereof;

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, that from and after the publication of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the justices in sessions for the county of Halifax to regulate and fix from time to time the rent or hire of the stalls in said market house, which rent or hire, and no more, shall in future be taken by the keeper of said market house, or clerks of the market, for the time being, of those who shall occupy said stalls.
