

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the Third, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Eleventh Day of June, Anno Domini 1782, in the Twenty-Second Year of His said Majesty's Reign; being the Fifteenth Session of the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province. 22 George III – Chapter 9

An Act to repeal an Act, made the last Session of the General Assembly, entitled, “An Act in addition to, and amendment of, and to reduce into one Act, the several Acts of the General Assembly, for regulating Carriers, and Owners of Waggon, Carts and other Trucks, travelling through the Province.”
