CAP. II.

AN ACT, for continuing in Force the several Acts herein mentioned.

KAR HEREAS the several Asts or Laws of this Province herein after WI mentioned are near expiring, and it is expedient that the same should be further Continued.

Preamble.

I. Beit therefore Enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That an Act made in the Twenty Sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Ast in Addition to, and Amendment of an Ast, to prevent Nuisances by Hedges, Wares and other Incumbrances obstructing the Passage of Fish in the Rivers in this Province; also an Act made in the same Year, intitled, an Ast to enable one or more Justices of the Peace to issue compulsory Process in the first Instance in civil Causes, which are by Law triable before them; also an Act made in the Fifth Year of His "Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Att for the Summary Trials of Ations; and also an At made in the Twenty eight Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Act to raise a Sum of Money to repair the public Road, leading from Halifax to Windsor, and to cause the Proprietors on each side of the faid Road, to settle the same more expeditiously, and every matter, Clause and Thing contained in all, and every the above mentioned Acts; and also in such as have been made in Explanation, Amendment or Alteration of any, or either of the fail Acts, all which Acts were revived and continued in Force by an Act made in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Ast for reviving and continuing in Force the several Acts therein after mentioned, shall be continued in Force, and each, and every of them are hereby continued in Force until the first Day of July, which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Two, any Thing in the faid Acts or either of them to the contrary notwithstanding.

CAP. III.

AN ACT, for continuing and amending the several Acts, for suppressing Unlicensed Houses, and for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Persons hereafter to be Licensed.

KINA HEREAS it has been found inconvenient, that Persons having w or taking out a Shop Licence, to retail, vend, or fell, Run, Brandy, Wine, Ale, Cycler, and other Spirituous Liquors within this Province, (the Town of Halifax excepted) should sell, Preamble. retail, or vend, any less Quantity than one Quart; for Remedy whereof.

No Person within thePrivince, T wa of Halifax on yexcente ,) having a shoo L cence, to tell or vend a lefsQ 19anticy of spirituous L quors than one Quart.

Licence Duty Afts to be in force un il the first July 1792.

Be it Enasted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the Publication hereof, it shall not be 'lawful, for any Person or Persons within the Province (the Town of Halifax only excepted) having or taking a Shop Licence, to retail, vend, or fell any less Quantity of Rum, Brandy, Wine, Ale, Cyder or any other Spirituous Liquors, than one Quart.

And be it surther Enasted, That the Act for suppressing Unlicensed Houses, and for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Persons hereafter to be Licensed, and the several Acts, in Addition to, or Amendment, or Alteration thereof, as amended, or altered by this A&, shall be in full Force, and the same, and the said Acts, and every Matter, Clause, and Thing therein contained, (except as before except ted) together with this Act, are hereby continued in full Force, until the first Day of July, which will be in the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Two.

CAP. IV.

AN ACT, for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year One I housand Seven Hundred and Ninety, and for appropriating fuch Part of the Supplies granted in the faid Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety, as now remain unappropriated.
