Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety, paid into the Treafury of this Province, that is to fay, to defray the Charges of Collection in the Diftrict of Halifax, Six Pounds and no more, on every Hundred Pounds there collected and paid, and Ten Pounds and no more on every Hundred Pounds collected and paid at all and every the other Diffricts and Out Ports in this Province; which feveral Allowances shall be in Lieu of all Fees, Perquisites and Expences whatever.

III. And be it further Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, to pay out of the Treasury of the Province, to the .Coroners of the different Counties, the Sum of Thirty Shillings, for .every Inquest taken during the faid past Year, on any Dead Body and properly returned to the Clerk of the Crown, fuch Sum to be applied to defray the Charges incurred by the Coroner for the Interment of fuch Dead Body, and any further Charge Attending fuch Inquest, fhall be paid by the County in which the fame shall be taken.

IV. And be it further Enasted, That the Perfon who has Acted as a Waiter and Guager in each of the Ports and Districts of this Province, 'during the faid past Year, (Halifax and Shelburne excepted,) shall be paid Five Pounds for every Hundred Pounds of Net Revenue collected in fuch Port or District (except as before excepted) and paid into the Treasury. Provided always, That if the Commissioners of the Revenue, have allowed the Collectors of Impost and Excise, in any District or Districts of the Province (Halifax, Shelburne and Annapolis excepted) to Discharge and execute the Duty of Waiter and Gauger, and to receive the pay of Gauger, the fame is hereby Ratified and Confirmed.

CAP. V.

AN ACT for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninty One, and for appropriating fuch Part of the Supplies granted in this Seffion of General Affembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

And a further Sum of Forty Pounds to the Meffenger to the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, and his Majefty's Council, for his Services for the fame Year. And a further Sum not exceeding Six Hundred Pounds to defray the Contingent Expences of the House of Assembly during the prefent Seffion, the fame to be drawn for by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, on the Certificate or Certificates of the Speaker of the House of Assembly, and not otherwise. And a further Sum of Thirty Pounds to the Speaker of the House of Assembly for Fuel, Servants, And-2 Extra Clerks and other Incidents during the prefent Seffion. further Sum of Ten Pounds to the Reverend Wingate Weeks, for his Atten-

Attendance during the prefent Session of General Assembly, as Chaplain to his Majefy's Council and the House of Astembly. And a further Sum of Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings to Adolphus Veith, for his Services as Serjeant at Arms during the prefent Seffion. And a further Sum of Ten Pounds to Peter Etter, Senior, Meffenger to the Houfe of Affembly, for his Services during the present Seffion. And a further Sum of Thirty Pounds to the Secretary of the Province to defray the Expence of his Office Rent for this prefent Year. And a further Sum of Thirty Pounds to the Suveyor General of Lands to defray the Expence of his Office Rent, for the fame Year. And a further Sum of Twenty Five Pounds to the Clerk of the Commissioners of the Revenue for his Services. And a further Sum not exceeding Thirtyfor the fame Year aforefaid. And a further Sum of Twenty Five Pounds to be paid to the Perfon who has the care of the Gunpowder in Halifax. And a further Sum of One Hundred Pounds to be paid to David Seabury, William Winniett, John Rice, and Dowie Ditmas with a Warrant on the Treasury, to be dated prior to the first Day of July in the prefent Year, which Warrant the Commissioners appointed by an Act passed this Session to fund the Debt due by the Province, and to raise a Capitation Tax, are hereby authorised to fund agreeably to the Provisions contained in faid Act.

And be it further Enatted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, to draw by Warrant on the Treasury such Sum or Sums of Money as may be peceffary to defray the Expences that may arise during the present Year, in maintaining Prisoners committed to the County

VI. And be it further Enasted, That all Warrants which the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, shall draw on the Treasury of this Province for any Sum or Sums of Money for the Services aforefaid, fuch Warrant or Warrants fhall
