An A C T for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty-nine, and for appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of General Affembly, and for funding the Province Debt.

May it pleafe your Excellency,

••••••• E His Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects the House of Assembly of His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, W towards appropriating the Supplies granted to His Magiefty in this Seffion of the General Assembly, and for fup-\$\$\$\$\$ plying the Exigencies of His Majefty's Government of Nova-Scotia, and for funding the Debt due by the Province, do humbly befeech, it may be enasted, And be it enasted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the First Day of July next, all Debts, Dues and Demands, of what kind or nature soever (except for Intereft) which are and shall be due and owing from the Treasury of this Province to any Person or Persons whatsoever, the same and every Part thereof shall be funded and secured upon the Faith and Credit of this Province, and after the fame shall be funded and fecured in the Manner herein after directed, the Sum and Sums of Money to due and owing shall bear Interest at the Rate of Six Pounds per Centum per Annum, which Interest shall be paid duly punctually to the feveral Perfons who shall be Proprietors of any Part of the Debt fo to be funded and fecured, the fame to be paid in equal half yearly Payments, and fo to continue until the Principal shall be paid off and discharged.

II. And the better to accomplif the foregoing Purpofes, Be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the Perfons who the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief shall appoint Commissioners of the Revenue, to advertife in the Royal Nova-Scotia Gazette for at least two Months, before the said First Day of July next, for all Perfons who have any just Demands on the Treasury of this Province, to deliver in the same at the Treasury, and such Perfon or Perfons as shall neglect to deliver in their Demands at the Time so appointed, shall be precluded from having his

or their Debt funded under and by Virtue of this Act until othe End of the next Six Months, when it shall and may be lawful for faid Commissioners to liquidate and settle all such Debts and Demands as shall be brought in at that time, in the fame Manner as specified to be done with the Debts brought in previous to the First Day of July next; and it shall and may be lawful for faid Commissioners, immediately after faid First Day of July next, to proceed to liquidate the feveral Demands which shall be brought into the Treasury as aforesaid, and to ascertain the Sum which shall be justly due to each Person on their several and respective Securities, both for Principal and Interest; and it shall and may be lawful for the faid Commissioners to deliver to each Perfon, having Demands as aforefaid, a Certificate, specifying the full Amount of the principal Sum due to fuch Perfons, which Certificate shall likewise specify that such Person or the Persons to whom fuch Certificate shall be legally transferred, in the Manner to be directed by faid Commissioners, shall be entitled to receive the full Amount of his or their Debt or Demand from the Treasury of this Province, together with lawful Interest as aforesaid, until the Principal shall be paid, and faid Commissioners shall cause a regular Stock Book to be opened in which the Names of all Stockholders and the Sums due to them shall be fairly entered, and in which all Transfers of Stock shall likewise be entered, and said Commissioners after having liquidated the Interest due on faid Debts up to the faid First Day of July next, it shall and may be lawful for faid Commissioners to grant to each Proprietor a Certificate of the Amount of the Interest due to him on his Debt as aforefaid, and at the End of every Six Months after faid First Day of July to grant to each Proprietor respectively a Certificate of the Interest due on fuch Proprietors Stock, which Interest Certificates shall entitle the Proprietor or Person to whom such Proprietor shall endorse the same, to receive on demand Cash at the Treasury for the full Amount thereof, and such Interest Certificates shall be received at the Treasury and by every Collector or Receiver of any Provincial Revenue Tax or Duty as Cash in Payment of any Debt or Demand due and owing to them respectively for and on behalf of the Province of Nova-Scotia.

III. And be it further enacted, That any Perfon or Perfons who fhall forge or counterfeit any Stock Certificate or Interest Certificate, or shall make any falle or counterfeit Transfer or Endorsement thereof, with intention to defraud the Government, or any Person or Perfons whatsoever, such Person or Persons so offending shall, if duly convicted, fuffer death without benefit of Clergy.

IV. And be it further enacted, That at the end of every fix Months, whatever Sum or Sums of Money shall be in the Treasury over and above what shall be sufficient to pay off the current demands thereon, fuch overplus shall be immediately applied by faid Commissioners. to pay

pay off part of the principal Sum to be funded as aforefaid, and before faid Commissioners proceed to pay off any part of faid principal Sum, they shall Advertife for at least one Month the Sum to be paid off, and shall offer to pay the fame to such Stockholders as will fell their Stock to Government at the lowest rates, and shall receive propotals from such Proprietors sealed which shall be publickly opened at the end of the Month, and the Stock of such Person or Persons as shall offer to fell at the lowest rate shall be purchased in by such Commissioners for Account of Government, so far as the Sum to be paid off will go for that purpose.

V. And be it further enacted, That all Warrants which the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being shall after the first day of *July* next, draw on the Treasury of this Province for any Sum or Sums of Money for the current fervice of the enfuing Twelve Months such Warrant or Warrants shall entitle the Perfon in whose favor the same shall be drawn or the Perfon to whom the same may be transferred to receive cash at the Treasury for the amount thereof, but no interest, and such Warrant or Warrants shall be received as cash by all Collectors or Receivers of Provincial Duties or Taxes payable to his Majesty within the Province.

VI. And be it further enasted, That by or out of fuch Monies as now are and from time to time shall be and remain in the Public Treasury of this Province, there shall be paid and supplied to the two Assistant Justices of the Supreme Court for their Salaries for the prefent Year. the fum of £800. in lieu of all fees and perquisites whatever.
