

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Twentieth day of March, 1793, and continued by several Prorogations to the 6th Day of June, 1797, in the 37th Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George The Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, being the Fifth Session of the Seventh General Assembly convened in the said Province. 37 George III – Chapter 9

An Act to revive and continue an Act, passed in the Thirty-third year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled, “An Act in amendment of, and in addition to, an Act, made in thirty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty, entitled, ‘An Act for regulating and maintaining a Light-House on Sambro Island;’ and in addition to, and amendment of, an act, passed in the twenty-eighth year of His present Majesty’s reign, entitled, ‘An Act for regulating and maintain a Light-House a the entrance of the harbour of Shelburne.’”

Whereas the before recited act, passed in the thirty-third year of the reign of His present Majesty, expired on the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, and it is expedient that the same should be revived and continued:

I. Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the said act, and every matter and clause therein contained, shall be, and is hereby, revived and continued to the first day of July, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and no longer.
