

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Twentieth day of February 1800, and thence continued by several Prorogations to the Ninth day of June, 1801, in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great-Britain, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. being the Second Session of the Eighth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. An Act to continue an Act, made in the Thirty-seventh year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to revive, and continue, an Act, passed in the Thirty-Third year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled, 'An Act in amendment of, and in addition to, an Act, made in the Thirty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty, entitled, 'An Act for regulating, and maintaining, a Light House on Sambro Island,' and in addition to, and amendment of, an Act, made in the Twenty-eighth year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for regulating, and maintaining, an Light House at the entrance of Shelburne Harbour.'"
