41 George III – Chapter 7

An Act to revive, and continue, an Act made in the thirty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to encourage the killing of Wolves, Bears, Loup Cerviers, and Wild Cats."

Whereas an act, made in the thirty-sixth year of his present Majesty's reign, to encourage the killing of wolves, bears, loup cerviers [lynx], and wild cats, was found to be of great public utility: and whereas, great damage still continues to be done to the farmers in different parts of this province, by wolves, bears, loup cerviers, and wild cats, killing and destroying their sheep and other cattle; for remedy thereof:

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the before recited act, and every clause, matter and thing, therein contained, be revived, and that the same shall continue, and be in force, for and during the term of three years, from and after the publication hereof, and no longer.
