And be it further enacted, That the several Officers of Government, who have Salaries provided for them by this Act, for the year one thousand eight hundred and four, and the year one thousand eight hundred and five; up to the first day of July, in the present year one thousand eight hundred and fix shall be paid at the same rate for and unto the thirty-first day of December, in the same year one thousand eight hundred and fix.

## CAP. II.

An ACT to revive, and continue in force, the feveral Revenue Laws, for the support of His Majesty's Government in this Province.

Preamble.

HEREAS the following Revenue Laws of this Province have expired, and it is expedient that the same should be revived and continued:
