*And be it further enacted*, That in case any unforeseen accident has happened, or should happen, to any of the Bridges or Causeways on the great public Roads of the Province, so as to interrupt Travellers, it shall be lawful for his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to order a Commissioner or Commissioners to repair or rebuild such Bridge or Bridges, or Causeways, or to remove any other unforeseen obstruction that may impede travelling. And the House of Assembly pledges itself to provide for the expence, not exceeding the sum of 400l. the Commissioner or Commissioners accounting for the expenditure thereof. And it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to draw Warrants on account, in favour of such Commissioner or Commissioners, provided the said sum or sums so drawn on account for such services shall not exceed the sum of Four Hundred Pounds.

*And be it further enacted*, That the several Officers of Government, who have Salaries provided for them by this Act, for the year one thousand eight hundred and four, and the year one thousand eight hundred and five; up to the first day of July, in the present year one thousand eight hundred and six shall be paid at the same rate for and unto the thirty-first day of December, in the same year one thousand eight hundred and six.

*And be it further enacted*, That the ninth, tenth, twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first Sections or Clauses of the Act, made and passed in the forty-first year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for applying certain monies therein mentioned for the service of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province" shall be and continue in full force and virtue, until the thirty-first day of December, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six, in as full and ample a manner as the same clauses would be were the same again herein repeated word for word.

## CAP. II.

An ACT to revive, and continue in force, the several Revenue Laws, for the support of His Majesty's Government in this Province.

**W**HEREAS the following Revenue Laws of this Province have expired, and it is expedient that the same should be revived and continued:

*BE it enacted*, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That the Act, passed in the thirty

*And whereas certain articles made liable to duties by the said Acts, or some of them, may have been imported into this Province since the expiration of the said Acts, and it is expedient that such articles, so imported, should be subject to, and pay, the said duties :*

Of dutiable Articles imported subsequent to the expiration of the Revenue Laws, and previous to the revival of them.

II. *Be it therefore enacted,* That it shall and may be lawful, for the Collectors of Impost and Excise, in the several Ports and Districts of this Province, immediately after the publication of this Act, to proceed to the warehouse or warehouses, vessel or vessels, of such person or persons who may have made importations of Wine, Rum, Sugar or Molasses, to cause an account to be taken, and an entry to be made, of all such articles respectively, as shall have been imported into this Province, since the thirty-first day of December last, and which shall remain the property of any such Importer, not being less than fifty gallons of Wine, or Rum, or other distilled Spirituous Liquors, or Molasses, or two hundred weight of Brown Sugar, to be paid, or security to be given, for the said duties (the additional Impost Duties excepted) in manner directed by the said Acts respectively.

III. *And be it further enacted,* That if, after the publication hereof, any such Importer shall sell, transfer or remove, any articles whatsoever so imported, and which by this Act are made subject to duty, without having entered the same and every part thereof, then remaining in his possession, or being his property, with the Collectors of Impost and Excise for the District or Place where such importations shall have been made; and if any quantity of the said articles, exceeding fifty gallons of Wine, Rum, or distilled Spirituous Liquors, or Molasses, or two hundred weight of Brown Sugar, shall be found in the hands, custody, or possession, of any such importer or stockholder, without having been duly entered as aforesaid (after account shall have been taken by the Collectors of Impost and Excise as aforesaid) and the duties secured as directed by the said Acts herein before revived; all such articles so found, or which shall be so sold, transferred or removed, shall and may be seized and condemned, in the manner and form directed by the said Acts, and such importer, so selling the same, shall be liable to the several penalties and forfeitures imposed by the said Acts, or any of them, on persons clandestinely landing such articles.
