



At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Eighteenth day of November, 1806, in the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third of Great-Britain, ~~France~~ and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. being the First Session of the Ninth GENERAL ASSEMBLY, convened in the said Province.*

CAP. I.

An ACT for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the service of the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Six, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

May it please your Excellency,

WE His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Assembly of His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, towards appropriating the Supplies granted to His Majesty in this Session of General Assembly, and for supplying the exigencies of His Majesty's Government, do humbly beseech that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that by or out of such Monies as now are, or from time to time shall be and remain in the public Treasury of this Province, there shall be paid and applied,

The sum of 100l. to the speaker of the House of Assembly, for his Salary during the present year.

100l. to Speaker of the Assembly.

And a further sum of 100l. to the Solicitor General, for his services for the same year.

100l. to Solicitor General.

And a further sum of 400l. to the Treasurer of the Province, for his Salary, and as Comptroller and Auditor of the public Accounts, and in lieu of Office Rent, Clerks, and all other Contingent Expences for the present year.

400l. to Treasurer

And a further sum of 116l. 13s. 4d. to Scroop Barnard, Esquire, the Agent for the Province, resident in London, for his services for the present year.

And a further sum of 100l. to the Clerk of the Council in General Assembly; and as Clerk to his Majesty's Council for the same year.
