CAP. I.

An ACT for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the fervice of the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Six, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Affembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.
