# C. IV.

#### Form of the Oath.

II. And be it further enacted, That to entitle any owner or occupier of Land to the foregoing Bounties, the following Oath fhall be taken by him or fome other perfon acquainted with the fact :

Anno quadragefimo feptimo GEORGII III.

" I, A B, do Swear, that Bushels of , were really and truly raifed on the " Lands occupied by , and the faid are wholly of the crop of the year One " Thousand Eight Hundred and Eight ; and that the wood from the Lands on which the " faid were raifed, was actually cut down, cleared and burnt off, fince the first day of " November, in the year One Thoufand Eight Hundred and Six."

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Justices in the feveral Counties and Diffricts in this Province, to hold a Seffion, either fpecial or by adjournment, in the respective Counties or Districts, between the first and fifteenth days of February, in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine, giving three weeks public notice of fuch meeting, for the purpose of determining all Claims for Bounties, granted by this Act; and that on the Oath herein before recited, and fuch further reafonable proof as fuch Jafti es may require, they shall determine on such Claims, and shall certify in one general schedule all such Claims as they allow for each County or Diffrict.

IV. And be it further enacled, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, to draw by Warrant, on the Treafury, for the amount of each of fuch fchedules, in favor of fuch perion or perfons as shall be appointed by the Juffices of each County or Diffrict, for receiving and diffributing the fame.

V. And be it further enacted, That fuch perfon or perfons, shall pay, without delay, the amount of all Claims allowed, when demanded, retaining one fhilling in the pound Commiffion, for receiving and paying fuch amount.

VI. And be it further enacted. That no claim for any Bounty under this Act, shall be admitted, which has not been preferred and allowed at the Seffion to be held as herein before directed.

### CAP. IV.

## An ACT to encourage the Filheries of this Province, by granting a Bounty on the importation of Salt.

### Preamble.

HFREAS the want of a regular importation of Salt. frequently caufes that article to become fcarce and dear, and occusions an interruption to the fifturies, and at other times the market bing overstocked, the importers suffer a loss, and are discouraged from continuing their importations : I Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That, whenever, du-

ring the year One thousand eight hundred and feven, any Salt shall be imported into this Province from Europe, Africa, or the Weft-Indies, and the price on the fale thereof at Auctiof Fine Salt. 155. on, from the Ship, in manner herein after-mentioned, shall not amount to the average fum or rate of fifteen (hillings Currency, per Hog(head, of common fine Salt, and Twenty-five fhillings Currency, per Hogfhead, of coarfe grained fifhery Salt, the owner, importer, or configuee, of fuch Salt, fhall be entitled to claim, and receive fuch bounty thereon, as, in addition to the average price for which fuch Salt fhall have been fold, fhall amount to the aforefaid price per Hogth ad of Fifteen Shillings, for fine, and Twenty-five Shillings, for coarle Salt. Provided always, That no bounty fo to be paid to any fuch owner, importer, or confignee, shall, in any cafe, exceed the rate of Two Shillings and Six Pence per Hogshead, on common ane, or Five Shillings per Hogthead, on coarfe-grained fifhery Salt.

Juffices to hold a selfion for determining all Claims for Bounties.

Governor empowered to draw Warrants on the Treafury for the amount of Clain.s.

Perfons appointed to diffribute Ciaims, allowed is. in the pound.

No claim to be allowed that has not been preferted to the Selfions.

#### Anno quadragefimo feptimo Georgii III. 1806.

II. And be it further enacted, That when any Ship or Veffel, laden wholly, or in part, with Salt, fhall arrive at any post or place of difcharge in this Province, and the owner, importer, or confignee, shall be defirous to make fale thereof, and shall not be able to procure the prices herein before mentioned, for the fame, and shall intend to claim the bounty granted by this Act, fuch owner, importer, or confignee, shall forthwith advertize the whole, or fuch part of faid Salt, for which he intends to claim a bounty, for fale at Public Auction, out of the Ship, and shall fell the fame in Lots, of not more than Ten hogsheads in a Lot.

III. And be it further enacted, That no perfon shall be entitled to claim for any Salt to be fold, pursuant to the directions of this Act, at any out port in this Province, any greater or higher bounty, than if the faid Salt had been fold at the Port of Halifax ; and all claims for any greater or higher bounty, shall be reduced and computed according to the average fales of Salt at the fame time by Auction, in the Port of Halifax; and if no fuch fale shall have taken place there, at that time, then according to the average price of Salt fold by Auction, at Halifax, last before the date of the Sale, for which, fuch bounty shall be claimed.

VIV. And be it further enacted, That before any bounty shall be paid, on any Salt fo fold as sforefaid, the perfon entitled to claim fuch bounty, shall procure from the Auctioneer, by whom fuch Salt shall have been fold, an Account of Sales, specifying the several lots, and parcels, the names of the purchafers, the quality or kind, and the prices of Salt, of the respective quantities fo fold, to which account, the Auctioneer shall annex and subscribe a Certificate, that fuch Sale was made by him, and was a true and fair Sale of the quantities of Salt, and for the prices in fuch Account specified ; and that the fame were the highest prices which could be procured at fuch Auction; and all salt, fo fold, fhall be meafured out of the fhip by a fworn Meafurer, whole Certificates of fuch admeafurements, to the respective purchasers thereof, shall also be annexed to the Account of Sales aforefaid; and the faid Vouchers shall be lodged in the Office of the Secretary of the Province, to be produced thereafter, to the General Affembly, if required; and thereupon it shall, and may be lawful, for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the Province in favor of the faid owner, importer, or confignee, of faid Salt, for the amount of the Bounty he may be entitled to receive, in manner herein before mentioned and limited.

Provided always, That the whole amount of the Bounties to be claimed, and paid, under and by virtue of this Act, shall not exceed the fum of One Thousand Pounds currency, and all fuch claims shall be paid according to the priority of the dates of importation, fale, and application, for the Bounty, to the extent, if claimed as aforefaid, of One Thoufand Pounds, and no further.

And be it further enacted, That if any part of the fum of One Thousand Pounds should remain in the Treasury at the end of the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seven, the Balance shall be applied as a Bounty on Salt imported and fold, during the year One Thoufand Eight Hundred and Eight, in the fame manner as herein specified.

### CAP. V.

## An ACT for granting a Bounty on Dry Cod and Scale Fish, exported to his Majesty's Islands, Colonies, and Plantations in the Weft-Indies.

E it Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That every exporter of Fish to the West-Indies, shall be entitled to a bounty of One Shilling and Six-pence, on on exponation to every
