vince, to make up fuch deficiency; and in case the monies so to be raised shall exceed Surplus. the faid fum of five hundred pounds, the furplus shall be added and carried to the credit of the general funds of the province.

V. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue and be in force during the natural life of Sir John Wentworth, and until the end of the next Session of the General Assembly after his decéase, and no longer.

## CAP, IV.

An ACT in addition to an Acl, passed in the Forty-Seventh Year of his present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to regulate the expenditure of Monies hereafter to be appropriated for the service of Roads and Bridges.

THEREAS the time limited by the said Ast for the appointment of Commissioners for direcling and superintending the expenditure of monses appropriated for the making or repairing of roads and bridges in the several counties and districts within this province, have expired, and such Commissioners have not yet been appointed in the present year:

I. BE it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That the period for appointing such Commissioners for the present year, shall be, and the same is hereby extended to the fifteenth day of June next.

## CAP. V.

An ACT for applying certain Monies to the purposes therein mentioned.

May it please your Excellency,

TE His Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects the House of Assembly of His Majefty's Province of Nova-Scotia, towards appropriating the supplies granted to His Majesty, and for supplying the exigencies of His Majesty's Government, do humbly befeech that it may be enacted,

I. And he it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That by or out of fuch monies as now are, or from time to time shall be and remain in the public treafury of this Province, and not already appropriated by the laws of this Province, there shall be paid and applied, a fum not exceeding seven hundred pounds to defray the contingent expences of the House of Assembly during the present session: the same to be drawn for by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, on the certificate of the Speaker of the House of Assembly, and not otherwise; and a further sum of sisteen pounds to the Reverend Robert Stanser, for his ser- Stanser. Dr. vices as chaplain to His Majesty's Council and the House of Assembly, during the prefent fession; and a further sum of seventeen pounds ten shillings to Charles Stewart Powell, for his services as sergeant at arms to the House of Assembly, during the prefent session; and a further sum of twelve pounds ten shillings, to Israel Conky, for his services as messenger to the House of Assembly, during the present session; and a

further sum of seven pounds to the door keeper of his Majesly's Council, for his attendance during the present session; and a surther sum of sour hundred pounds for the purpose of repairing the roof, painting the inside, and for erecting an iron railing round the western area of the new government-house, also towards erecting tences around the said house, and the garden belonging thereto, the same to be expended under the direction of a commissioner to be appointed by his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, for that purpose; and a further sum of two hundred and si'ty pounds for the purchase of new surniture for the levee-room, the drawing room and dining room, of the new government-house; the same to be expended under the direction of a commissioner, to be appointed as aforesaid.

Light house.

II. And be it further enacted, That the sum of three hundred pounds of the monies granted at former sessions of the General Assembly for the supporting and lighting the light-house at the entrance of the gut of Annapolis (which light-house has lately been destroyed by sire) and remaining in the Treasury, shall be applied to build by contract, and sinish a light house at such place, at the entrance of the Gut of Annapolis aforesaid, as his Excellency the Licutenant-Governor, with the consent of His Majesty's Council, shall direct; to be expended under the direction of a commissioner or commissioners, to be appointed by his Excellency the Licutenant Governor for that purpose.
