At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Twentieth day of February, Anno Domini, 1800, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Twenty-Eighth day of November, 1805; in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great-Britain, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. being the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

46 George III – Chapter 1

An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the service of the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Four, and the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Five, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in the last and present Session of the General Assembly as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

May it please your Excellency,

We His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the house of assembly of His Majesty's province of Nova-Scotia, towards appropriating the supplies granted to His Majesty in the last and present session of general assembly, and for supplying the exigencies of His Majesty's government, do humbly beseech that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that by our out of such monies as now are, or from time to time shall be and remain in the public treasury of this province, there shall be paid and applied

The sum of 100 l. to the late speaker of the house of assembly for his salary for the past year.

And a further sum of 100 l. to the present speaker of the house of assembly, for his salary during the present year.

And a further sum of 100 l. to the solicitor general for his services for the past year. And the like sum of 100 l. for his services for the present year.

And a further sum of 400 l. to the treasurer of the province for his salary, and as comptroller and auditor of public accounts, and in lieu of office rent, clerks, and all other contingent expences for the past year. And a like sum of 400 l. for his services the present year.

And a further sum of 116 l. 13 s. 4 d. to Scroop Barnard, Esq; the agent of the province for his services for the past year. And a like sum or 116 l. 13 s. 4 d. for his services the present year.

And a further sum of 100 l. to the clerk of the council in general assembly, and for his services as clerk to His Majesty's council for the past year. And a like sum of 100 l. for his services for the present year.

And a further sum of 30 l. for defraying the expences of the council in general assembly for the past year. And a like sum of 30 l. for the same service for the present year.

And a further sum of 100 l. to John Howe, for printing for government, and the general assembly, for the past year. And the like sum of 100 l. for his services for the present year.

And a further sum of 50 l. to the keeper of the council chamber, and house of assembly for the past year. And the like sum of 50 l. to the same person for the said service the present year.

And a further sum not exceeding 90 l. to be paid on the certificate of the commissioners of the revenue, to the land-waiter of the port of Halifax, for his services for the past year. And the like sum not exceeding 90 l. to be paid as aforesaid, for his services the present year.

And a further sum not exceeding 250 l. to be paid on the certificate of the commissioners of the revenue, at the rate of 7 s. 6 d. per day, when employed, and at the rate of 2 s. 6 d. per day when umemployed, to such person or persons as shall have been in the service of the collectors of impost and excise, and the inspector and searcher of the district of Halifax, as extra waiter or waiters of the port of Halifax, during the past year, and at the rate of 5 s. per day to temporary waiters, together with ten per cent. to be paid out of the net proceeds of the government part of such seizure or seizures as such extra waiter or waiters, or temporary waiter or waiters, shall appear to have been instrumental in making. And a further sum not exceeding 250 l. to be appropriated and paid for the like services, and on the said conditions, as aforesaid, the present year.

And a further sum not exceeding 150 l. to the inspector and searcher employed in the district of Halifax for the last year, to be paid on the certificate of the commissioners of the revenue. And a further sum not exceeding 150 l. for his services for the present year, to be paid as aforesaid.

And a further sum of 25 l. to assist the inhabitants of Manchester, and the Gut of Canso, to open a road from Boylston, at Milford Haven, to the Gut of Canso, near John Wheaton's.

And a further sum of 33 l. to aid the inhabitants of Oyster Ponds to erect a new bridge over Goose Harbour, the old bridge being carried away.

And a further sum of 15 l. for the road from Manchester to Traccadie [Tracadie].

And a further sum of 50 l. to aid the inhabitants of Guysborough and Manchester to build bridges over the north, east, and west rivers, at the head of Milford Haven, on the main road leading from Guysborough to Antigonish.

And a further sum of 25 l. for the road from Lunenburgh [Lunenburg] to Lahave River.

And be it further enacted, that in case any unforeseen accident has happened, or should happen, to any of the bridges or causeways on the great public roads of the province, so as to interrupt travellers, it shall be lawful for his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to order a commissioner or commissioners to repair or rebuild such bridge or bridges, or causeways, or to remove any other unforeseen obstruction that may impede travelling. And the house of assembly pledges itself to provide for the expence, not exceeding the sum of 400 l. the commissioner or commissioners account for the expenditure thereof. And it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor, from time to time, to draw warrants on account, in favour of such commissioner or commissioners, provided the said sum or sums so drawn on account for such services shall not exceed the sum of four hundred pounds.

And be it further enacted, that the several officers of government, who have salaries provided for them by this act, for the year one thousand eight hundred and four, and the year one thousand eight hundred and five; up to the first day of July, in the present year one thousand eight hundred and six shall be paid at the same rate for and unto the thirty-first day of December, in the same year one thousand eight hundred and six.

And be it further enacted, that the ninth, tenth, twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first sections or clauses of the act, made and passed in the forty-first year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for applying certain monies therein mentioned for the service of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, and for appropriating such part of the supplies granted in this Session of General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province" shall be and continue in full force and virtue, until the thirty-first day of December, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six, in as full and ample a manner as the same clauses would be were the same again herein repeated word for word.
