

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Twentieth day of February, Anno Domini, 1800, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Twenty-Eighth day of November, 1805; in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great-Britain, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. being the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

46 George III – Chapter 7

An Act to revive, and continue, an Act, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for the better support of the Poor in the respective Counties of this Province, by laying an Impost Duty on articles imported into this Province from the United States of America."

Whereas the above recited act hath expired, and it is expedient that the same should be revived and continued:

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, that the said act, and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall be revived, and continued: and the same is hereby revived, and continued in force until the thirty-first day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and six, and no longer.
