

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Eighteenth day of November, 1806, and continued by several prorogations to Thursday the third day of December, 1807, in the Forty-eighth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Second Session of the Ninth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 48 George III – Chapter 16

An Act for altering the time of holding the Supreme Court in the Districts of Pictou and Colchester.

Whereas in and by an Act passed in the forty sixth year of his Majesty's reign, the annual circuits of the supreme court are directed to be held at Truro, in the district of Colchester, on the first Tuesday of June; and at Pictou, in the district of Pictou, on the second Tuesday of June; which is found to be inconvenient:

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the Supreme Court for the District of Colchester, shall hereafter be held at Truro, in said District, on the second Tuesday of June; and for the district of Pictou, at Pictou, on the first Tuesday of June annually.
