ing the said Bells, or either of them, and from destroying or injuring them, or either of them, or injuring the Ropes thereof, and to enforce the said regulations by imposing a fine not exceeding the sum of twenty shillings for each offence.

Punishment of transgressors.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the parent or parents of any child, or children, under age, who shall be found transgressing any of the said regulations so to be made as aforesaid, and the master or masters, mistress or mistresses, of any apprentice or apprentices, who shall be found transgressing any of the regulations so as aforesaid to be made, shall be subject and liable to the fine or penalty so to be imposed by the Justices as aforesaid, to be levied off their goods and chattles respectively.

Chimney Sweeps to give Bond.

Violation of Bonds. X. And be it further enacted, That all persons to whom licences shall be granted, shall enter into bonds for carrying on the sweeping of chimnies duting the time for which their licence shall be granted; and in case of neglect or resulas of the persons licensed, or those employed by them, to comply with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Firewards, and approved of at a Court of General or Special Sessions of the Peace, that the person so neglecting or resuling shall forfeit and pay for each and every offence, a fine not less than five shillings, nor more than twenty shillings, to be recovered before any one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace, on the oath of one credible witness, and if the person or persons convicted of such neglect or resulas, shall not have sufficient goods and chattles, whereon distress may be made to the value of the penalty recovered for such offence, or shall not pay such penalties within ten days after such conviction, then, and in such case, such Justices may, by warrant, commit such offender to the County Jail or House of Correction, there to remain for a term not exceeding ten days.

## CAP. XIV.

An ACT to alter the time of the Sitting of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, and General Sessions of the Peace, in the County of Hants.

Sittings.

Proviso.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That in future the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, and General Sessions of the Peace, for the County of Hants, shall be held at Windsor, in the said County, on the first Tuesday of January, and first Tuesday of July, annually, the sirst sitting to be held on the first Tuesday of January next, any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding. Provided always, That nothing herein contained, shall affect the sittings of the said Courts to be held in Windsor in the present month of April.

## CAP. XV.

An ACT to alter the Meetings of Parishioners for the choice of Vestry Men and Church Wardens, for the several Parishes in this Province.

Future Vestry Meetings. E it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and A sembly, That fuch meetings shall hereafter be held annually, on the Monday next after Easter Day, and not otherwise.
