CAP. XVI.

An ACT in amendment of an AA, passed in the thirty-fourth year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the Preservation of Partridges, and Blue-Winged Ducks.

TAT HEREAS, the time prescribed by the said Act for the preservation of Partridges, has been found by experi-Preamble. ence not to answer the purpose fully :

I. BE it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That from and Partridges not after the publication hereof, no person or persons (except as in the Act of which this is an amendment are excepted) shall, under any pretence whatsoever, kill any Partridge within this October. Province from the first day of March until the first day of October: any person or persons transgressing shall be subject to the same penalty for each and every offence, as is imposed by the Act of which this is an amendment.

CAP. XVII.

An ACT to continue and amend the Act, passed in the forty-eighth year of his present Majesty's Reign, entitled. An Act to provide for the accommodation and billeting of his Majesty's Troops, or of the Militia, when on their march, from one part of the Province to another; and the Act, passed in the fifty-first year of his said Majesty's reign, in amendment of the said Act.

DE it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That the faid Act, passed in Billeting Act the forty-eighth year of his present Majesty's reign, entitled, An Act to provide for the accommodation and billeting of his Majesty's troups, or of the militia, when on their march from one part of the Province to another, except such part thereof as is amended by this Act; and the faid Act, passed in the fifty-first year of his said Majesty's reign, in amendment thereof -be, and the same is hereby continued until the fifteenth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and from thence until the end of the next Session of the General Assembly, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted, That, instead of one shilling allowed by the said Act to the Allowance for Innkeepers for each meal furnished by them to Soldiers when on their march, there shall be Billeting. allowed and paid fifteen pence for each meal which shall be by them furnished to Soldiers under the provisions of the faid Act, of which this is an amendment, and no more: any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding.

CAP. XVIII.

An ACT to continue in force the feveral Acts therein mentioned.
