

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, in the Fifty-second year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the First Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 52 George III – Chapter 5 (Session 1)

An Act to revive and continue an Act, passed in the thirty-second year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to regulate the Summary Trials of Actions, before His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, in the Town and Peninsula of Halifax," and to revive and continue the several Acts in amendment to the said Act.

Whereas the discontinuance of the said act has been attended with much inconvenience, for remedy whereof:

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that, from and after the publication hereof, the said recited act, entitled, "An Act to regulate the Summary Trials of Actions, before his Majesty's Justices of the Peace, in the town and peninsula of Halifax," and the several acts in amendment of the said act, and every matter, clause, and thing, therein contained, shall be, and the same are hereby revived and continued, in full force and virtue, until the thirty-first day of March, in the next year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, and thence until the end of the next session of the general assembly, and no longer, any thing in the said acts contained, to the contrary notwithstanding.
