

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Tenth day of February, 1814, in the Fifty-fourth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fourth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 54 George III – Chapter 13

An Act for altering the time appointed for holding the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, and General Sessions of the Peace, in the County of King's County, in the Spring of the Year.

Whereas the time for holding the courts of common pleas, and general sessions of the peace, at Horton, in the county of King's county, on the second Tuesday of April, has been found very inconvenient:

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the court of common pleas, and general sessions of the peace, for the county of King's county, shall be annually held at Horton, in said county, on the third Tuesday of May, and second Tuesday of October – any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.
