

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Tenth day of February, 1814, in the Fifty-fourth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fourth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 54 George III – Chapter 20

An Act to alter the time of the Sitting of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, and General Sessions of the Peace, for the County of Cumberland.

Whereas it has been found inconvenient to hold the said inferior court, and sessions of the peace, immediately after the sitting of the supreme court in the month of June, for remedy whereof:

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that from and after the next sitting of the said court and sessions at Amherst, the said inferior court, and general sessions of the peace, shall be held at Amherst, in the said county, on the second Tuesday of April in each year, instead of the month of June; any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding.
