

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Ninth day of February, 1815, in the Fifty-fifth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fifth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 55 George III – Chapter 13

An Act to continue an Act to provide for the support of a Light House at the South End of Coffin's Island, on the Eastern side of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour.

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the fifty-second year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, "An act to provide for the support of a Light-House on the South End of Coffin's Island, on the Eastern Side of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour," be continued, and the same is hereby continued, in full force and virtue, for the space of three years from the publication hereof, and from thence until the end of the next session of the general assembly.
