

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Ninth day of February, 1815, in the Fifty-fifth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fifth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 55 George III – Chapter 7

An Act to revive and continue an Act, passed in the fifty-first year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act for the more easy recovery of Debts against Co-Partners and Joint Debtors."

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that from and after the publication hereof, the act, passed in the fifty-first year of his present Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for the more easy recovery of Debts against Co-Partners and Joint Debtors," be revived, and the same is hereby revived and continued in full force and virtue, for and during the space of three years from the publication hereof, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly.
