Anno quinquagefimo octavo Georgii III.

An ACT to regulate the payment of the Monies due to the Province for Provisions supplied to the Inhabitants, and to apply the fame to the service of Roads and Bridges.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient that the sum of 6,000l. due to the Province under the Act, passed in the fifty- seventh year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the Importation of certain kinds of grain, flour and meal, and for furnishing the same to such settlers within the Province as are in indigent circumstances. owing to the failure of crops, be applied in payment of a part of the appropriations for the service of Roads and Bridges in the several Counties and Districts, in the present year.

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That the fum of 8121.7s. 3d. from the County of Sydney;

1981. 28. 6d. from the County of Lunenburgh; be expended and applied to the fervice of Roads and Bridges in the feveral Counties and Diffricts, where the fame are feverally due, as aforefaid.

II. And be it further enacted, That the perfons who are indebted in the feveral Counties and Diffricts aforefaid, for provisions, fhall be at liberty to difcharge the amount of their debts, by performing labour on the Roads and Bridges, under the direction of the Commiffioners for Roads, in or near the feveral Townships or Diffricts where fuch debtor refides; provided the fame shall be performed on the Roads and Bridges, at fuch times and places as shall be pointed out by the Commissioners, on or before the first day of August next; and it the fame shall not be then difcharged by labour as aforefaid, or otherwise, to the fatisfaction of the Commissioners, the Treasurer of the faid several Counties and Diffricts shall enforce the collection of fuch debts as by law directed.

III. And be it further enacled, That the Justices of the Peace, in the Courts of General or Special Selfions, to be held for that purpole, shall cause a Schedule of the names of such debtors to be made out, and class them, and shall furnish the Commissioner with a list thereof, fo as to direct the expenditure of the labour to be performed under the Commissioner, to be done on the Roads and Bridges in or near the Township where such debtors reside.

IV. And be it further enacled, T hat the monies now in the hands of the Treasurers, or which fhall be by them collected, fhall be paid over to such Commissioners as shall be authorized by the Court of Sessions to receive the same in such proportions as shall be determined by the faid Court of Sessions.

Credit for Labour. V. And be it further enacled, That perforts who shall perform labour in satisfaction of their debts as aforefaid, shall be entitled to receive a credit for such labour so performed, at the rate established by the Act for regulating the expenditure of the monies for Roads and Bridges.

Schedule of Monies to be transmitted to Treasurer. VI. And be it further enacled, that the fum of 6,000l. applied by this Act, shall be confidered part of the sum of 20,000l. granted for the service of Roads and Bridges in the present Session. VII. And be it surther enacled, that the Court of Session in each County and District, shall

return into the Office of the Treasurer of the Province, a Schedule of the money by them appropriated under the provisions of this Act, to be expended by the feveral Commissioners in such County or District.

CAP. XVII.

An ACT in addition to, and an endment of, an Act, passed in the forty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the repairing, keeping in repair, cleaning and paving the Streets, in the Town and Peninfula of Halifax, and for removing obstructions therein; and also, to suffered the power and authority vested in the Surveyors of Highways, within the Town and Peninfula of Halifax, after the first day of August next, during the operation of this Act.

DE it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That when and fo often as the Commiffioners shall have proceeded, as directed by the eighth fection of the faid Act, to afcertain the line of any fireet, lane or highway, within the Town of Halifax, for any perfon or perfons about to crect any building thereon, and the perfon or perfons about to build shall be diffatisfied with the line pointed out by the faid Commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for the Chief Juffice, or any other Judge of the Supreme Court, in Term Time, or during Vacation, upon the application of the Commissioners, or the perfon or perfons to diffatisfied, to iffue a precept to the Sheriff of the County of Halifan, or his Deputy, to fummon a jury of the freeholders of the faid Town of Halifax, nowise interefled in establishing or altering the line of the faid street, to meet at some convenient day therein mentioned, to view and lay out the line of fach fireet, or lane, or highway, who thall have an oath administered to them, by the Judge who shall issue the precept, well and truly to lay out, and fix, the line of fuch ftreet, lane or highway, according to the beft of their skill, and judgment, and the witneffes, if any shall be offered by either party, shall be sworn before the faid Judge, and if the jurors, or either of the parties shall require it, a new survey shall be made of the line of fuch street, lane or highway, which being done, the Sheriff or his Deputy shall make a return forthwith, under the hands of himself and the jurors, to the Judge, who having approved and confirmed the fame, shall direct the faid return to be filed in the Office of the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, and an exemplification thereof to be deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General. Provided always, That if
