the faid Judge shall not approve and confirm the faid return, a new precept may be iffued, Return of Jurys for the purposes aforefaid, and the faid Judge shall direct by whom the costs and expenses of not confirmed. the faid proceedings shall be paid, which faid costs and expenses shall be taxed, and shall in no cafe exceed ten pounds.

## CAP. XVIII.

## An ACT to continue an Act, to establish Grammar Schools in feveral Counties and Districts in this Province ; and also the Act. passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, in amendment thereof.

D Eit enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That the Act, passed in the fifty-B first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An A& to establish Grammar Schools in feveral Counties and Diffricts of this Province, and the Act, made in the fifty-fourth year of His Majefty's Reign, in amendment thereof, be and the fame are hereby continued for the term of Seven Years from the publication hereof, and from thence to the end of the next Seilion of the General Affembly, and no longer.

Continued for seven years.

## CAP. XIX.

An ACT to amend and continue an Act, passed in the fifty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the better regulation of Solicitors and Proctors, practifing in the Courts of Law and Equity in this Province.

DE it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That the faid Act, entitled, An Act for the better regulation of Solicitors and Proctors, practifing in the Conttinued se-Courts of Law and Equity, in this Province, and this Act, in amendment thereof, be, and ven years. the fame are hereby continued, for the term of feven years, from the publication hereof, and until the end of the next Seffion of the General Affembly.

II. And be it further enacted, That any perfon who shall have obtained the degree of Bachelor of Arts, in any College or other Seminary of Learning, duly authorifed to confer such degree, shall be entitled to admission to practice, under the Provisions of the faid Act, at the expiration of four years Clerkship, instead of five years; any thing in the faid Act contained to the contrary notwithflanding.
