by all lawful ways and means, the title, rights and interest of the Crown, under and by virtue of fuch refervations, in the same way, and by the same ways and means, that the same might or could have been done, previous to the passing of this Act.

## CAP. XXIII.

An ACT to extend the provisions of an Act, passed in the first year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act, in addition to, and amendment of, an Act, entitled, An Act for preventing Trefpasses to the town of Pictou, and the Town Plot of Dartmouth.

WHEREAS, it has been found necessary to provide some more effectual means for preventing Swine and Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the publication hereof, the faid Act, passed in the first year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, An Act in addition to, and amendment of an Act, entitled, An Act for to Pictou and preventing Trespasses, and all the several matters and things therein contained, shall be, and Dartmouth. the same is hereby extended to the Town of Pictou, including all the streets, lanes, and highways, from David Patterson's East line on the West, to the West line of the lot formerly Alpin Grant's on the East of the said Town; and to the Town Plot of Dartmouth, bounded on the North by the Common, on the South and West by Halifax Harbour, and on the East by Mill-Brook; and after the payment of the third part of the value of all such Swine Fines. or Goats as may be forfeited by the faid Act to the profecutor, the remainder shall be paid to and for the use of the Poor of the said Towns respectively, within the said limits.

## CAP. XXIV.

An ACT to continue the several Acts of the General Assembly now in force, relating to the Militia.

E it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That the Act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of the Reign of His present Majesty, entitled, An Act, to revive, alter, and continue, the several Acts of the General Assembly then in force, relating to a Militia; and every matter, clause, and thing therein contained, be, and the same is hereby, to 18th March, continued until the eighteenth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and from thence to the end of the next Sellion of the General Assembly and no longer.
