CAP. XXV.

An ACT to continue an Act, passed in the fifty-first year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the more easy recovery of Debts against Co-Partners and Joint Debtors.

DE it enacted, by the Lisutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That from and after the publication hereof, the faid Act, passed in the fifty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the more easy recovery of Debts against Co-Partners and Joint Debt-Act 51st. Geo. III. continued ors, be continued, and the fame is hereby continued in full force and effect, for the space of feven years'from the publication hereof, and from thence to the end of the next Seffion of the General Affembly.

CAP. XXVI.

An ACT to continue and amend an Act, passed in the thirty eighth year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for regulating the exportation of Red or Smoaked Herrings, and in amendment of an Act, passed in the second year of His present Majefty's Reign, entitled, An Act for regulating the exportation of Fish and the affize of Barrels, Hoops, Boards, and all other kinds of Lumber, and for appointing Officers to furvey the fame.

BE it enocted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That the faid Act, en-titled, An Act for regulating the exportation of Red or Smoaked Herrings, and in amendment of an Act, passed in the second year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for regulating the exportation of Fifh, and the affize of Barrels, Hoops, Boards, and all other kinds of Lumber, and for appointing Officers to furvey the fame, and every matter, claufe and thing, therein contained, be, and the fame is hereby, continued in force until the eighteenth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and from thence until the end of the next Seffion of the General Affembly and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted, that from and after the publication of this Act, the owner of all red or fmoaked herrings put in boxes or kegs, for fale or exportation, shall mark on the faid boxes or kegs with a brand or in any other manner not eafily to be effaced, the initial letter of his christian name and his furname at full length; and the Infpector also who shall inspect such red or smoaked herrings, shall also mark the faid boxes or kegs with a brand containing the initial letter of his christian name and his furname at full length; and if any owner or owners shall sell or export any red or smoaked herrings, or if any Inspector shall infpect any red or imozked herrings, and not mark the boxes or kegs as aforefaid, he shall forfeit and pay two shillings for each and every box or keg to fold or exported, or to inspected without marking in manner as aforefaid.

III. And be it further enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any inspector to inspect any red or imoaked herrings until the fame shall be offered for fale or ready to be shipped for exportation, and until required by the purchaser or exporter thereof, nor to mark with the Harrings brand aforefaid, any box or keg containing that article until he shall open and examine, and fufficiently reclose each and every box or keg, and if any Inspector shall inspect any red or Imoaked herrings contrary to the intent and meaning of this Act, and of the Act, of which this Act is an amendment, he shall forfeit and pay for each and every offence a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

IV. And be it further enacled, that all penalties imposed by this Act, shall be recovered before any two of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, one half thereof to the perfon who that Penalties profecute for the fame, and the other half to the use of the poor of the Township where the offence shall be committed.

CAP. XXVII.

An ACT to prevent the iffue of Notes or Bills by any corporate body within this Province for the payment of money.

WHEREAS, it may become highly injurious to the public, if the practice of issuing of Notes or Bills for the payment of money, and putting the same in circulation as current money, by corporate bodies not Preamble .expressly authorized so to do.

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That it shall not be Corporate Bolawful for any corporate body within this Province to iffue any Bills or Notes for the paydies not allowed ment of money, for the purpole of circulating or for supplying any want, or pretended to issue Bills or Notes want of a medium in trade.

II. And be it further enacted, that if any corporate body within this Province shall, from Violation of this and after the publication of this Act, iffue any Bills or Notes for the payment of money, for Act the purpose of circulating the same as money, the Charter of such Company shall be, from the time of the iffue of fuch Bill or Bills, ip/o facto woid and of none effect.

CAP. XXVIIL

An ACT to continue in force the feveral Acts therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the several Acts herein mentioned be further continued.

Be it therefore enacled, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That an Act made in the thirty-fourth year of His Majefly's Reign, entitled, An Act to provide for the trial of Iffues by Justices of Nifi Prius in the Counties of Sydney, Lunenburg and Shelburne; also An Act passed in the forty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act, for the secu.
