

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Eighth day of February, 1816, in the Fifty-sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 56 George III – Chapter 17

An Act providing an Annual Pension for Judge Monk, on his retiring from office.

Whereas, George Henry Monk, Esq. on account of his declining health, has obtained permission from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, to resign his Commission as an Assistant Justice of His Majesty's Supreme Court. And whereas, in consideration of the many services performed by the said George Henry Monk, for this province, during a long course of years in various public employments, it is reasonable that provision should be made for his future honorable support:

I. Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that there shall be paid to the said George Henry Monk, Esq. yearly and every year, during his natural life, the annual or yearly sum of four hundred pounds, currency; which sum shall be drawn from time to time, out of the monies in the treasury of this province, by warrant of the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief of this province, for the time being.
